

Conditions for Application	The applicant must meet the standards stipulated by the Immigration Services Agency for applying for a Certificate of Eligibility.		
	 Your purpose needs to be to study Japanese for higher education, not for employment. Do not use Japanese language schools as a means of entering Japan for job hunting. You need to have ability to pay expenses during your stay in Japan. 		
	• You need to have a history of studying at a public educational institution for at least 12 years.		
	• You need to be approved by our document screening and interview to make sure that there is no problem enrolling in our school.		
	· 2-year-course students and 1-year-and-9-month-course students must have		
	Japanese language proficiency level N5 at the time of application. 1-year-and-6-month-course students must have Japanese language proficiency level N4 at the time of application.		
	 You must not have a habit of drinking alcohol and smoking cigarettes. 		

Proof of Japanese language ability

- One of the followings specified by the Immigration Services Agency is required as proof of Japanese language ability.
- 1. Must be certified at N5 or above in the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) conducted by the Japan International Educational Support Association and the Japan Foundation.
- 2. Obtain a score of 300 or more on the BJT Business Japanese Proficiency Test conducted by the Japan Kanji Proficiency Test Association.
- 3. Must be certified as grade F or higher in the J.TEST Practical Japanese Proficiency Test conducted by the Japanese Language Proficiency Test Association/J.TEST Secretariat, or have obtained a score of 250 or more on the FG level exam.
- 4. Must be certified at level 5 or above of the Japanese NAT-TEST conducted by Senshu Kyoiku Publishing.
- 5. Obtain a score of 350 or higher on the STBJ Standard Business Japanese Test conducted by the Association for Applied Japanese Language Education.
- 6. Be certified as Beginner A or higher in the TOPJ Practical Japanese Proficiency Test conducted by the TOPJ Practical Japanese Proficiency Test Implementation Committee.
- 7. Must be certified at the beginner level or higher level of the J-cert Japanese Language Proficiency Test for Daily Life and Professional Skills conducted by the International Human Resources Development Organization, a public interest incorporated foundation.
- 8. Must be certified as JCT5 or higher in the JLCT Japanese Language Proficiency Test for foreign national conducted by the Japan-Language Proficiency Testing Organization for foreign national.
- 9. Receive a certification of C- or higher in the Practical Japanese Communication Test Bridge (PJC Bridge) conducted by Certify Co., Ltd.
- 10. Obtain a score of 315 or higher on the JPT Japanese Language Proficiency Test conducted by the Japanese Language Proficiency Test Implementation Committee, or a score of 68 or higher on the JPT Elementary test.

Tuition fee refund policy

- (1) If you notify our school of your intention to decline admission in writing (email is acceptable) by the day before admission to our school, the refund will be made as follows:
 - Tuition fee, teaching material fee, insurance premiums, and examination fees, excluding screening fee and entrance fee, will be refunded.
- (2) After admission, screening fee, entrance fee, tuition fee, and teaching material fee will not be refunded regardless of the reason for withdrawal. However, insurance premiums and examination fees will be settled and the remaining balance will be refunded.
